Course Number and Title:

EDUC 540

Curriculum and Instruction Program Capstone

(May be cross listed with ED 599 Independent Study/Project Completion).

Academic Credit:

3 graduate credits

Course Rationale:

The capstone experience is designed to bring reflection and focus to the whole of the curriculum and instruction program experience. It encourages students to integrate facets of their own personal and professional goals with important concepts of theory and best practice from related coursework. The capstone provides an ideal setting for conducting authentic assessments of what students know and are able to do.

Course Description:

The capstone course is an opportunity for students to demonstrate that they have achieved the goals for learning established in their professional development plan. This project should take into consideration all of the courses leading to this degree and focus on a student's personal interest area(s) as they relate to improvement in two of the INTASC teaching standards.

Place of Course in the Curriculum:

This is the final course in a sequence of 12 courses, and is required of all students seeking an Education Masters degree with an emphasis in Curriculum and Instruction.

Course Goals and Objectives:

The goals of this course are:

1. Draw connections between professional development plan and theory and best practice
2. Demonstrate mastery of content material within student's professional development plan
3. Utilize advanced skills (critical thinking, problem solving, quantitative and qualitative reasoning)

Students who successfully complete this course will:

- Produce a quality artifact demonstrating increased knowledge, skills and competency in a minimum of two INTSAC standards identified in the student's professional

development plan for inclusion in their portfolio.												
Course Content: Completion of program capstone paper or project following ED 595 Educational Research Design												
Methodology: Methods of instruction that work well for this course include, but are not limited to: A. Lectures B. Readings C. Written Assignments D. Videos E. Case Studies F. Journaling												
Student Roles: 1. Explore interests to choose a problem, project or topic to complete a capstone paper 2. Develop a proposal 3. Conduct an expanded literature review 4. Conduct a comprehensive study to address the problem or topic chosen 5. Include findings and solutions in final written paper (APA style writing required)												
Assessment: Enter the method category and percentage assigned to each method. The total should equal 100%.
