Part 1: Personal and Professional History

I am a native of Nebraska and grew up in the inner city of Omaha. I attended Assumption Catholic grade school until the third grade. At the age of eight, my parents separated and we moved from an all-white Czech neighborhood in South Omaha to a lower income predominately black area in North Omaha. The move was a tough transition for me, but after I met new friends and learned about cultures other than my own, it was a tremendous experience. I finished the rest of my elementary education at Fontenelle Elementary. Then I attended Monroe Middle School for seventh and eighth grade and then Omaha Benson High School for grades nine through twelve. Through these years, an appreciation for diversity was the most valuable lesson that I learned. Being active in sports such as baseball, football, basketball, swimming, and soccer, instilled in me the values of, hard work, teamwork and the will to win. After getting a scholarship to play baseball in 1996, I headed off to college, initially for the wrong reasons. I thought I would become a professional baseball player and that school was the avenue to provide that. After transferring from numerous schools (i.e., Bellevue University, Illinois Central, Iowa Western and University of Nebraska at Omaha), I had the pleasure to meet an instructor at Peru State College who changed my view on education. He taught me the importance of education and the similarities of education and sport.

From that point forward I focused on my education and used baseball to pay for it. By becoming a teacher I gained the opportunity to share my story and experiences with students so they don't make the same mistakes I made. Doing my student teaching practicum at Kiewit

I also work with some of the coaches in the building to help adjust and critique their sport teams distinct lifting programs.

Summary of Learning

Over the last two years I have grown tremendously, spiritually and educationally. Spiritually I had my eyes opened to the way God works through human beings in vocation made me think a lot about how I am as an extension of God. Being a teacher, I shape and sculpt children with the help of God. This is also done through my other vocations such as a father, husband, neighbor, and friend. Often, I feel like I have put more emphasis on the latter, rather than the former, and thus have neglected my vocation as a teacher. This experience has made me realize that I am an extension of God's hand, and I am in position to perform his works every day. To put it another way: I give myself to the Lord so that he performs his works through me. Incorporating this concept into my teaching vocation, has made me work even harder than I do, giving everything I can everyday to make a difference for children with God's guidance. My behavior has changed towards the children as well. I am more encouraging and understanding; whereas in the past I would be quick to judge or hand out punishment. By taking a more forgiving and loving approach, I am beginning to make decisions based on the moral consequences rather than just emotional ones. Such an approach will be especially important when I become an administrator, due to the fact that one of my weaknesses is making quick decisions. Taking time and letting the situation play itself out will allow me to receive all of the facts so I don't make a decision based off of emotion. Being an extension of God's providence puts a lot of pressure on me to just be a good person at all times, in all of my vocations, regardless of the situation. This is much easier said than done, and as is the case with so many of us, it is something with which I struggle. I feel like I have strengthened my

bond with the Lord, but have become, and will continue to become, a more effective teacher and role model to my students and my peers. Bringing ethics into my work has done wonders for me because I use it as a tool to evaluate myself as a man of God and an extension of his works. That is why I believe that ethics in vocation has had such a profound impact on the way I go about my everyday duties as a teacher, husband, father, friend, and neighbor.

I have long considered myself Christian in my approach as a father, husband, neighbor, and friend. I never thought about being that Christian man at school, in some part due to my misinterpretation of the separation of church and state. There is a difference, however, between promoting Christianity and displaying Christian principles. Recognizing this distinction, has allowed me to make huge strides as a teacher. For instance, my attitude has changed in my approach to students characterized as "thugs" or those who are in school for the wrong reasons. I now have a positive outlook and approach to these students, and I have noticed the positive impact my attitude and new approach has on these students. For who am I to judge or to selectively adopt only those Christian principles that are convenient to my lifestyle? There is a popular phrase, too often ignored, that goes like this, "What Would Jesus Do?" While difficult, I want to respond to this question affirmatively in my interactions with all students.

Looking back, I know that it is who I am and it is the person I strive to be every day. I have worked hard at my job, and have gained the respect of my fellow teachers and most students. This is great, but have I done enough? Bringing "ethics" more fully into my work has made me a better teacher, role model, and leader. This program has helped me to break religion down to every aspect of my life. I really appreciated this program on so many levels obviously from a

teaching standpoint it has made big dividends, but on a personal level it has strengthened my foundation as a father, husband, neighbor, and a friend. Thank you for facilitating this experience for me.
