COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Foundations & Philosophy of Education EDUC 502

Communicates key elements of the education profession and evaluates current trends, issues and approaches in professional education programs.

Educational Psychology EDUC 503

Explores the psychology of learning. As an interdisciplinary blend of psychology and education, it addresses both theoretical and practical issues.

Principles of Middle School Pedagogy EDUC 504

Examines curricular and instructional strategies for middle school grades 5-8. Interdisciplinary curriculum, personalization of learning, instructional technologies, and other teaching strategies for the early adolescent are discussed, modeled and practiced.

Principles of High School Pedagogy EDUC 505

Evaluates the different types of secondary schools and their structure/organization, the implications of federal and state legislation on school systems as it pertains to student instruction, and effective characteristics of secondary student instruction. The course emphasizes instructional analysis, standards-based lesson plan and unit plan construction, instructional strategy selection, and classroom management implications.

Integrating Technology into the Classroom EDUC 506

Gives educators a solid understanding of educational technology and how to apply 21st century skills to the classroom.

Reading and Writing Across the Curriculum EDUC 507

Shows students how to incorporate reading, including study skills; writing; speaking; listening; research and inquiry, and technology and media into specific content areas.

Multiculturalism, Exceptionality & Human Relations in a Pluralistic Society EDUC 508

Increases student knowledge and awareness related to issues of multiculturalism and exceptionality.

Educational Assessments: Tests & Measures EDUC 510

Provides an in-depth understanding of formal and informal student assessment including assessment design and analysis.

Introduction to Special Learner Populations & Law $\,$ EDUC 511

Focuses on issues related to the characteristics of special needs populations on both ends of the academic spectrum, classroom strategies for instruction of special needs populations and litigation resulting in the mandated provision of services for children with special needs.

Professional Ethics & the Law EDUC 512

Emphasizes the integrity of the teaching profession, including both building and modeling character and a Christian value system, and legal considerations; this course is the capstone course.

This online post-baccalaureate certification program is available to those who already have a bachelor's or master's degree and an endorsable field of study recognized certifiable by the Nebraska Department of Education.
