The courses marked with * require field experience.

A total of 110 hours of field experience is necessary to complete the program. If the candidate is presently serving in an educational setting, most of their field work may be completed in their own classroom. Candidates must have depth in their field experience by documenting as part of their field work hours, experiences in an infant-toddler, pre-primary and primary setting as required with those courses.

Candidates must successfully complete 16 weeks of student teaching, 10 of which is completed in a pre-primary or infant/toddler setting and at least six weeks in a primary (K-3rd grade) setting.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Foundations of Education EDUC 500

Examines key elements of the education profession and evaluates current trends, issues, and approaches in professional education programs.

Educational Psychology EDUC 503

Explores the psychology of learning. As an interdisciplinary blend of psychology and education, it addresses both theoretical and practical issues.

Parent Education FL528

Examines lifespan faith and moral development of children and parents; parenting practices and processes; changing family contexts; training and delivery systems; and the impact of norms and policies upon families.

Differentiating Instruction to Increase Student Achievement EDUC 531

Learn how to determine important differences in students' points of entry to the classroom and uncover implications for class management; for working with students and parents; and creating assessments.

Language and Culture EDUC 526

Examines the relationship between language and culture, their influence on each other as well as their effect on community, identity, beliefs, and values.

Early Childhood Education History and Foundations ${\ensuremath{\sf EDUC}}\,{\ensuremath{\sf 563}}$

Focuses on the history, philosophy and current trends in early childhood education.

Children's Literature FDUC 564

Learn how to select, evaluate, and use literature appropriate for early childhood programs; history and methods of presenting children's literature for enhancement and enjoyment.

Enhancing Learning Through Linguistic and Cultural Diversity EDUC 532

Explores teachers' views on the value of linguistic and cultural diversity and the powerful learning opportunities it affords today's classrooms and schools.

The Young Child: Language and Literacy Development EDUC 565

Emergent literacy instruction and assessment.

Early Childhood Program Organization and Management EDUC 574

Focuses on organizing, planning, managing, and evaluating programs for young children.

Infants and Toddlers: Development, Methods, Curriculum, & Assessment (Birth-age 3) EDUC 578

A focused look at the development of children from birth to three; methods, curriculum and assessment for this age group.

Pre-Primary Education: Development, Methods, Curriculum & Assessment (Ages 3-5) EDUC 580

A focused look at the development of children from three to five; methods, curriculum and assessment for this age group.

Primary Education: Development, Methods, Curriculum & Assessment (Ages 6-8) EDUC 583

A focused look at the development of children from six to eight; methods, curriculum and assessment for this age group.

Educational Research Evaluation & Design EDUC 594

Evaluation of information, with emphasis on the ability to relate this data to professional growth. Development of skills in qualitative and quantitative research methods.

Advanced Child Development and Psychology PSY 521

An advanced study of children development and factors which pattern personality development and learning.

Serving and Leading in Community and World SOC 565

Vocation; roles of the early childhood educator.
