## **Analysis of artifacts:**

1). PERFORMANCE CRITERIA\* - How was data analyzed? (attach rubrics/scoring tools if used). Data was analyzed using presentation scores (Rubric) and student scores on corresponding sections of the written exams of rules and regulations of specific recreational sports.

### **Summary of RESULTS\*:**

Can a student effectively communicate the rules and regulations of a specific recreational sport to their classmates?

Success for assessment was defined as 80% of the students achieving a score of B or better on written exam(s) of the rules and regulations of specific recreational sports. Analysis showed that for each of the 6 specific recreational sports, 90%+ of the students scored a B or better on the written exams. Furthermore, group presentation scores ranged from 86.67-91.11% as assessed using the attached rubric.

- 3). **INTERPRETATION\*** Discuss how the results answer the assessment question(s). A grade of a B or better (80%+) according to the 2017-2018 CUNE Undergraduate Catalog (p17) is categorized as "commendable mastery of the material". Therefore, based on the summary of the assessment results, it is concluded that the transfer of content knowledge was successful and the student outcome of being able to effectively communicate the knowledge related to the rules and regulations was met.
- 4). Observations made that were not directly related to the question(s). (i.e. interrater reliability of the scoring tool was low) Revised rubric from previous year seemed to work well in specifically addressing elements of the presentation.
