General Education Committee: Background: What factors caused the committee to choose this particular assessment outcome? The committee selected this outcome based upon the emphasis on developing a strong knowledge base in the general education curriculum.

•This is to be a self-published small booklet• Your idea can take almost any physical form, but is most often small and handheld

• You should include the element of being handmade, as well as elements of handwriting, drawing, collage, etc

• Your final product is not just thrown together but composed using elements/principles of design Using the provided materials, pencil, colored pencil, colored paper, etc. create a zine that follows principles and elements of design. It must be an original idea (no clichés or ideas that have been used before with minor changes). It must have at least one interactive or shaped page and consist of 3-4 spreads plus a front and back cover. The front cover must have a title and the back cover should contain your name.

- a. *How does this data address the assessment question?* The photographs of the projects will be visual and examples of completion of the goals.
 - i. Include/attach a description/example of assessment tool to be used.
- **2.** *How will data be collected?* All artifacts will be photographed and archived digitally. Once completed the Department of Art will assess the artifacts.
