Class size: 16 students, with top score of 40 for clarity of writing (accuracy of content was ignored for this assessment). Actual scores: 40, 40, 40, 39, 39, 39, 39, 37, 37, 36, 35, 34, 33, 27, 20, 16.

- 10 students (62 percent) met the standard (36–40 points), 3 (19 percent) approached the standard (31–35 points), and 3 (19 percent) were below standard (1–30 points). 81 percent met or approached the standard; our goal was 80 percent, so the results slightly exceeded our goal.
