Fowler's Stages of Faith Formation



6	(Quite Rare) Universalizing Faith	A non-dualistic approach to life. Sees oneself as part of whole regardless of nationality, social class, gender, age, race, political ideology, or religious tradition.
5 🕏	(Middle Adulthood) Conjunctive Faith	Adult thinker recognizes multiple perspectives, paradoxes, and can hold more than one at a time.
40	(Early Adulthood) Individuative-Reflective Faith	Adult takes on faith as identity. Personal responsibility, religion, social justice, beliefs, etc. become important.
3 •	(Adolescence) Synthetic-Conventional Faith	Teen begins to recognize stories, actions, examples of faith in those outside of family. Internalized faith begins.
2 .	(School Age) Mythic-Literal Faith	Child begins to take on stories, actions, examples of faith as belonging to community.
19	(Toddler-Early Childhood) Intuitive-Projective Faith	Fantasy filled, imitative phase. Child influenced by stories, actions, examples of faith in primary adults.
0 💠	(Infancy-Age 2) Primal and Undifferentiated	Attachment bonds develop laying foundation for trust and meaning-making www.brittneydoll.com





1. Experienced faith

Infants assume the faith of their care givers, as it is what they are first exposed to - their first and vital exposure to Christianity.



2. Affiliative faith

Children start copying what they see in those around them; they will join in because 'everybody else does it.'

Four stages of faith



3. Searching faith

Children start asking questions, trying to understand the things they have already been taught, so they can decide whether they believe this themselves.



4. Owned faith

This is when a child passes through the searching stage and gets to a place where they 'own' their faith.
