Why go abroad?

Students going abroad - for academic credit - work with the Director of Global Opportunities to follow established procedures for Concordia University, Nebraska (CUNE).

Eligibility to Participate in a Program Abroad_____

Because CUNE partners with a number of program providers we must approve each student's status for participation in programs run by these other providers.

Recommendation to a program is based on the student meeting these criteria:

- ✓ full-time status with upper class standing (2nd semester sophomore or higher)
- ✓ proposed abroad experience fits student's academic program & academic plan
- ✓ complete <u>Study/Intern Abroad Application</u> & <u>Academic Plan</u> & approved by Concordia before applying to a specific program
- √ good university standing

A student has good university standing at CUNE if they:

- √ have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher (needed for campus & program abroad qualification)
- ✓ are making satisfactory progress in their program of study
- √ have no holds on their academic, financial, or student accounts
- ✓ are not under disciplinary action or academic probation

Specific programs abroad may have additional application process requirements. Programs may require a higher minimum GPA, year in school, faculty recommendations, language level assessment, essay, etc.

Study Abroad Process for Concordia Students_

First steps to discover what is possible!	
	Visit with the Director of Global Opportunities about the CUNE application process, including
	application procedures, program options, funding strategies, etc.
	Talk to your family about your plans to go abroad. Share about process, program locations,
	requirements, costs, timeframes, etc. Pick up a copy of <i>A Parent Guide to Study Abroad</i> .
	Check with them on what financial resources you have (and will need) to spend time abroad.
	Determine if any personal health issues need to be addressed before applying to go abroad.
	Apply for a passport NOW if you don't have one already!
Figure out your academic plans!	
i igui c	Plug study abroad into your four-year academic plan - go for whole semester? part of summer?
	Save gen ed courses and specific content courses for your study abroad semester/summer.
	Look for courses that fit requirements needed for your major, minor, or gen ed.
	Make a list of specific classes you need. Courses in culture, history, literature, fine arts, language,
	global/multicultural, and service-learning are easy to find in programs abroad.
	Courses must be able to transfer back toward requirements of your program. (vs. all electives)
	Meet with your academic advisor to review anticipated study abroad courses (and course descriptions
	in the academic catalog) to determine how the credits will fit with your degree plan.
	Students planning to take Spanish should also meet with Prof Amy Royuk for course approval.
	Go to Via TRM to complete a travel profile if you haven't already done so: via-go-cune.via-trm.com
	and use the programs generated as a start to your research.

Go back to via-go-cune.via-trm.com to complete and submit the Study/Intern Abroad Application for your chosen program - you'll then be directed to complete and submit your Academic Plan. Complete CUNE application as early as you can - at least 30 days prior to provider deadline. Note that program deadlines vary - program provider deadlines are generally ... Fall: Mar 1-Jun 1 Spring: Oct 1-15 Summer: Mar 1-May 1 (Feb 1 for internships) ✓ The Director of Global Opportunities will notify campus administrative offices (Student Life, Registrar, Student Financial Services) on your application for campus approval. ✓ You will be notified by the Director if there are any issues to fix or if you have been approved. Once approved you'll receive emails to complete additional campus items (Academic Plan, Emergency Contact info, etc.) in Via. Apply to the specific Program Provider! Once notified, apply to the study abroad program you have chosen. Pay application fee or program deposit directly to the program provider. Request official CUNE transcripts from the Registrar's office. Go to http://transcripts.cune.edu/ for directions to order a transcript. Notify the Director of Global Opportunities when you have applied - and on your acceptance status by the study abroad program. Once accepted, meet with the Director of Global Opportunities for any additional study abroad advisor signatures needed by the provider and to review Next Steps in Concordia's process. Financial Details to Keep in Mind Student pays the study abroad program fees for that semester - not Concordia tuition/fees - the amount could be more or less than CUNE - depending on the program chosen. ✓ Student is not eligible for CUNE institutional/athletic/performance scholarships or tuition waivers for the semester they will be off campus for study abroad. ✓ Student is still eligible for other financial aid - such as Federal student loans, Federal grants, Pell Grants, Federal Parent loans, state grants, District or church scholarships, etc. ✓ Student should complete FAFSA, Title V requirements related to receiving Federal funds and other requirements to secure federal aid, well in advance of a study abroad semester. ✓ **CUNE receives bill** for program tuition/fees and student pays through their student account. ✓ **CUNE charges a small study abroad fee** for the term abroad for administrative processes. Summer Internships or Independent Studies_ ✓ Students participating in **internships** also follow Career Center internship processes and complete campus internship forms. An academic charge for credit is applied for summer internships. ✓ Students participating in language schools where CUNE would be granting credit, would complete an independent study form and pay normal summer tuition per credit hour.
